I governments and people are increasingly anxious about the misuse of drugs. In the United Kingdom the government gives a high priority to tackling this problem. Drug misuse has increased significantly over the last decade. There are few towns or cities which have not found themselves in some way touched by the tragedy and distress which it brings. Parents PLEASE BE AWARE that drugs are easily available in our area, and many of these transactions are taking place at Rave parties or Hippie communes. It is a sad fact that youngsters can obtain a variety of drugs within our own community. Of those young people who try illegal drugs, most obtain them from friends. As a rule, experimentation with drugs such as cannabis and LSD does not start until middle to late teens. Even then, very few in this age range will have access to heroin, crack or cocaine

The efforts of the police and customs will never be able to completely stop illegal drugs coming into the country. It is frightening to think that some Colombian cartels can lose nine out of ten light aircraft transporting certain types of drugs, and still make a profit.

"So how can I tell whether my child is taking drugs?"

It isn't easy, especially when a child first tries drugs or only takes them occasionally. Many signs are just like the normal signs of growing up, so if your child suddenly becomes

THROUGHOUT the world, moody or distant, don't jump to congovernments and people are inclusions.

Be aware of:-

Sudden and irregular changes of mood, unusually aggressive.

Loss of appetite.

Gradual loss of interest in school, hobbies, sports, friends, etc.

Uncharacteristically drowsy or sleepy. Increasing evidence of lying or other furtive behaviour.

Loss of money or other valuable objects from the house.

Unusual stains, marks or smells on the body or clothes, or around the house.

Other clues left in the bedroom could be:-

Scorched pieces of tinfoil.

Home-made pipe.

Remains of a cannabis cigarette with small cardboard tube filters.

Cigarette papers, when the user does not usually use roll-ups.

CRIME BUSTERS REVIEW


