FOXHOLES NATURE RESERVE OPEN DAY

Sunday 9th May, 2 - 5pm

Take this opportunity to enjoy an afternoon out in the countryside with teas to look forward to at the end of your walk. The 160 acre nature reserve, managed by Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire Naturalists Trust, is open to everyone, with a way-marked route through the woods posted with guides to provide information. This is the best time of year to see the semi-natural woodlands as the usual spectacular display of bluebells should be at its most breath-taking.

Tea and cakes are on sale in the garden of Foxholes House, where there is also pond-dipping for children, a BBONT sales table and a plant stall. Entry is £2 per car, which includes a map of the reserve showing the marked trail.

The reserve covers a variety of habitats - woodland, watermeadow and scrub - which support a huge and diverse population of plants, mammals, birds and insects. If you are not already a visitor to Foxholes, you can find the reserve at Bruern - turn right for Bruern Abbey and then left along the unmarked private road.
