CRIME CANNOT LIVE in a community that cares". More than anything, Neighbourhood Watch is about working together as partners for a safer and more caring community. The police alone cannot be responsible for crime prevention. We need to work together with local authorities and other agencies. But most of all we need to work with you.

Local communities are better placed than anyone to be aware of what's happening in their neighbourhood. Building and responding to that awareness is a vital part of Neighbourhood Watch. Please consider setting up a support group for Neighbourhood Watch in your street, or part of a street.

At present I have responsibility for twenty-four groups, which I try to see at regular intervals. This may appear to cover our parishes with great ease, but many more co-ordinators are needed. At present our area is suffering from daytime burglaries, where offenders arrive and leave under the general eye of the public, but who notices?

Neighbourhood Watches would firstly be self-supporting. I would attend when possible as part of a group, but I would not expect to have control over events, but would act more as a "Consultant" and would provide means to access other agencies where appropriate.

Each group would appoint a co-ordinator who would act as a



contact and spokesperson between residents, local police and other agencies.

Some records may need to be kept and often arrangements are made for street signs to be erected. The coordinator would need to sustain the interest of the group members because in a relatively low crime rate area keeping enthusiasm within a group can sometimes be quite hard.
