A Cross Country Runner

Burford schoolgirl Nikki Slater looks to be one of the country's best middle distance prospects. At only eighteen she is already the holder of five English schools gold medals in events ranging from 1500m to cross country. She has captured four national titles and the trend looks set to continue in the future.

One influential figure in Nikki's achievements has been her coach Harry Wilson, former coach to Steve Ovett. Nikki has often said that a lot of her success is down to her coach; "Harry has given me a lot of confidence and he gets me in the right shape for the big races when it really matters".

Nikki's first taste of victory came in an English Schools International Competition when she was still only fourteen years old. She flew the flag in style for England and has continued to do so ever since. Since those early days the West Oxfordshire teenager has continued to dominate the ranking list in events such as 1500m, 3000m and in cross country.

Nikki's first real break came in 1994 when she strolled home to victory in the National Cross Country Championships, which subsequently gained her selection for the world class country championships in Budapest. In that race she finished a creditable 11th saying "So far this has been the biggest achievement I know, but I didn't think I would come that well placed". What makes Nikki's performance even more pleasing was that one British girl and two Europeans only had 2 years left in the under 20 age group.

In that summer, 1994, Nikki continued her winning streak and won the under 20 national 3000m in Bedford. Victory in that race assured her selection for the World Junior track Championship in Portugal. There, after a series of heats she finished 12th, whilst still dominating the British ranks. The 1995 cross country session again saw Nikki on superior form as she collected another national cross country title and demonstrated a sure footed display in a series of races from October to January.

However Nikki's plan to success has not all been smooth. When favourite to obtain selection for the World Cross Country Championship in Durham, she managed only 5th. Clearly this was below par performance for Nikki who had previously been unbeaten by a British Junior girl for two years. Nikki said "I don't know what happened but I think I must have been too tired from all the training and my A Level studies were beginning to get on top of me". But Nikki's determination managed to lift her to 27th in the World Cross Country Championships and 2nd British Girl.

Although she is slightly down on her previous year's performance she is still eligible for the under 20 Age Group. She says "This year has been a difficult year as I have had my A Level exams in the summer. It is important for me to get the grades as I want to go to university". Next year she hopes to go to Birmingham where she will benefit from the sparkling facilities on offer. But for now her sights are firmly set on gaining selection for the European Junior Track championships in Hungary.

ABOUT THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD SCHEME

The Duke of Edinburgh is an award scheme for young people between 14 - 25 years old. You can join this scheme and do it in your own leisure time.

There are three different awards which you can gain. They are Bronze, Silver and Gold.

BRONZE AWARD = You can start at any time after your 14th birthday.

SILVER AWARD = You can start at anytime after your 15th birthday.

GOLD AWARD = You can start anytime after your 16th birthday.

All of these awards must be finished before your 25th birthday.

All of the awards are separate. As long as you are old enough you can start from Bronze, Silver or Gold. You don't have to start from bronze.

When you have completed the award you have been working towards you will receive a badge and a certificate.

Each award contains a Service, a Skill and Physical Recreation. Also you will have to undertake an expedition. The expedition will vary from 2 to 4 days depending on the level of the award.
