Most of the oldest children spent a residential week in North Wales – working hard and enjoying themselves at a wide range of activities including going underground to an old slate cavern, underground to a modern power station and orienteering as well as mountain climbing. They returned tired but very happy, as did the five members of staff who accompanied them.

We are now looking forward to the rest of the summer term using the spacious field as often as the weather will allow and getting our swimming pool into full working order.
