Fostering and Adoption

Sophie (6), Jack (3) and David (10) are three children waiting for new families with whom they can live until they grow up. They can't wait too long. They need the love and security that long-term foster carers or adoptive parents could give them right now.

Oxfordshire County Council Social Services Department are looking for long-term foster carers and adopters for a number of children like Sophie, Jack and David. Most of these children are between 3 and 13 years old. Some of them have special needs. All of them need someone to come forward to offer them a permanent home. We try in most cases to keep brothers and sisters together so we often need families who can take more than one child.

All sorts of people can become foster carers or adopters. You can be married or single, age is no barrier and educational qualifications are not required. All you need to start with are the qualities common to every good parent. You will receive training and regular support. Foster carers are paid generous allowances (these allowances do not affect entitlement to Income Support). Dependent upon circumstances, some adoptive parents can be given financial support too.
