## The Internet has reached WYCHWOOD Library!

As part of a countywide project involving 22 small libraries run by Oxfordshire County Council, your local library now has an Internet terminal. It's there for you to use, whether you want to send an e-mail to a relative on the other side of the world, find out that vital and elusive piece of information, or simply surf the web.

This exciting new facility has been made possible by a grant from the DCMS/Wolfson Public Libraries Challenge Fund. There was stiff competition for these grants from across the country, and Oxfordshire County Council was one of only 18 successful applicants out of 66 local authorities which put in bids.

Access to many core information sites is entirely free. There is no charge to use the Internet to visit such sites as BT's Phonenet (UK phone books), Railtrack (railway timetables), BBC, Citizens Advice Bureau, OFSTED and the Oxfordshire County Council website Oxfordshire Online. We do have to make a charge, however, for e-mail and general web surfing.

Why not come along to the library and find out more? Ask for our leaflet which gives the basic information you will need. If you are familiar with the Internet, you will be ready to go online straight away. If you are not quite sure of what the Internet offers, or are not confident of using it unaided, just ask the staff for help.
