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VOX PROJECT

The VOX Project, is supported by Oxfordshire Learning Disability Trust, and is focused around the Witney and Chipping Norton areas. The project aims to utilize young volunteer support to enable people with a learning disability to become rightful and included citizens in their own neighbourhoods.

The VOX project is funded by Millennium Volunteers, a national government-backed scheme to encourage young people to make a sustained commitment to volunteering for the benefit of the community. It is designed to provide opportunities for young people aged between 16-24, who are at a formative point in their lives, and the aim is that they will develop and retain an interest in volunteering.

Millennium Volunteers will gain valuable experience, which will broaden their horizons and employment opportunities. They will receive training and skilled support, to enable them to achieve a nationally recognised Millennium Volunteers Award (awarded for 200 hours volunteering).
