Wychwood Forest: a different perspective

Mixing aerial photography with views of the landscape seen from eye-level, Ken Betteridge, Chairman of the Friends of Wychwood, will on 27th October present an illustrated over-view of the boundaries and central area of the ancient royal hunting Forest of Wychwood. The 'flight' will highlight the many historic and environmental features of this fascinating area, which in Norman times stretched from Burford to Woodstock and from near Chipping Norton to Eynsham.

The Friends of Wychwood support the work of the Wychwood Project, which aims to raise awareness of, and appreciation for, the history and identity of Wychwood and to conserve and restore the special character and habitats of the local forest landscape.

The Project has this summer created a 37 mile circular footpath around the Wychwood area, on waymarked rights of way. Copies of the accompanying Trail Guide will be on sale, together with Discovering Wychwood, a history and guide to Wychwood, and a beautifully illustrated map showing Wychwood before the Enclosures.
