**Mary Knowland** works mostly on boards, some curved, to create abstract landscapes inspired by views from the Cotswolds to Cornwall.

**Doris Sinuns** also does watercolours but in a more representational style. Her loose, colourful images of flowers are inspired by her joy of colour.

**Ariana Clarke Windle** includes flowers among her vibrant pastels along with her landscapes and the intimate, evocative interiors for which she is well known.

**Betsy Matthews'** ceramic pigs always provoke a smile, as well as her simple, fish-crowded bowls.

**Lesley Williams** also include fish motifs in her stunning blue and green bowls and plates.
