The Original Garage

The old tin garage was very different to the working conditions I was used to; there was no running water or sewage disposal on site. I collected a bucket of water from the brook to detect punctures in car tyres. On occasions when nature



called I locked the garage door and chased off home! I started selling petrol from a very old pump, which sat between two trees. In a very short time I found that water was getting into the underground petrol storage tank. BP Petrol Co. agreed to supply a new storage tank, with a repayment of re-directed profit for five years. The next problem was installing it; Gordon Earley had just purchased a Massey digger and agreed to dig a large hole. After a lorry load of

ballast and twenty bags of cement; the tank, filled with water to stop it floating out of the ground, was lowered into the hole. I borrowed a mixer from my lifelong friend Nick Reynolds and after nine hours of hard slog the job was done. The old tin workshop was falling down; no windows, no waterproofing, no heating and very poor lighting – a dreadful place to work in! We needed a new workshop! Once we got approval we worked on cars from 8am until 6pm and then from 6pm to 9pm we built the workshop.
