The Wychwood magazine is the latest organisation to join the digital revolution; spurred on by our ever increasing use of computers and the availability of Oxfordshire Rural Broadband, our local community service. The experimental Wychwood online site is now launched at:

The site is designed to provide our regular readers with access to the latest information in the area and to promote The Wychwood to a wider community.

The Site Pages

The *Home* page describes The Wychwood and provides links to other community sites.

There is a *Highlights* page featuring the current editorial, with summaries of highlights from that issue.

The *Events* page lists all the events in the Wychwood of which we have been notified and where applicable links to the event's own web sites. Remember, to get your event on this page we need to know about it in advance. It will be posted on the site as soon as it is received by us and then featured in the next edition of the magazine. Plan ahead, we are currently posting events as far ahead as September to ensure they are in everyone's diary!

The *Editorial* page gives you photographs of our committee and details of how to submit an article for The Wychwood. There is even a Word Template to download to help you! The *Archives* page gives you access to

selected articles from our last 25 years. In time we hope to have the whole archive on-line; right now you can find Volumes 1 (1980-81) and Volume 25 (2004-05). The final main page is our *Advertisers*. This gives you a classified link to each of our advertisers including links to their own web pages or email addresses where we have been notified of them.
