Cooking Up a Storm

25 students from Year 7 joined a cookery club organised by me and run on the same lines as 'Ready, Steady, Cook' on Thursdays after school. A box of fresh locally-produced food is delivered each week from nearby Foxbury Farm. The students are divided into four teams and challenged to make a meal from the ingredients in just one and a quarter hours, with half an hour to eat the meal and tidy up.

On Thursday 11th May, the group had a visit from Gavin Alcock, head chef of the *The Fleece* in Witney. His job was to help and inspire the groups to use the ingredients in the most imaginative way. You may have seen Gavin and the students that evening on BBC South Today or even heard them on BBC Radio Oxford. When asked whether he preferred cooking in his restaurant

kitchen to working with twenty-five 11-12 year olds Gavin said, "No competition, the restaurant wins every time!"

Lamb stir fry
