I've just done 40 more miles than usual on my last tank full of petrol, simply by taking my foot off the accelerator when going down hills.

The cool new term for economical driving is Hypermiling. It's a brilliant way to save petrol and save money, and of course is good for the environment.

Tips from www.hypermiler.co.uk can give you up to a 40% increase in your miles per gallon. Here are a few of them to get you thinking;

Keep the car regularly maintained and serviced; keep your tyre pressures correct; keep the air conditioning off, it can increase fuel consumption by 10%. Slow down! A reduction of 20mph can increase your mpg by 45%; turn off the engine in traffic jams — you're doing zero mpg while it's on and going nowhere! Even without hypermiling, there's a great way to save petrol - Drive less! Help save the 233 bus route!
