
A Little Note from Max Of Fetes and Snakes

Act Quickly

Adder bites can be treated using 'viper venom antiserum' which my carer says is very hard to get hold of! He used to get the antiserum from the hospitals but they no longer seem keen to supply it. Now he has to go on a begging mission whenever he needs some. If no treatment is given then the outlook can be very grim. My carer says that if your dog goes lame suddenly and you suspect a snake bite then it is best to contact him or one of his colleagues asap.
