
## A Million Reasons to Read a Book World Book Night

After hearing a mention last autumn on Radio 4 that a scheme was afoot to find volunteers to give away a million books, I rushed to the computer to find out about World Book Night.

The night in question was March 5<sup>th</sup> 2011, and 20,000 volunteers were needed. We had until 4<sup>th</sup> January to register, and I

think I must have been one of the earliest, and was thrilled to be chosen. I collected the 48 specially printed copies of my book in February.



The scheme is funded by a group of publishers who chose 25 books from a poll of favourites across the industry. I chose Philip Pullman's *Northern Lights*. He is an Oxford author; the book begins in Oxford; it is the first of a trilogy, so if you like it you can read on; and also, I found the story mesmerising. It's the story of the girl Lyra, starting in an ancient Oxford college, and taking her on a journey to the far north in search of a kidnapped friend. It has daemons and



armoured bears, witches and gyptians, and the mysterious Dust. It creates a whole extraordinary, beautiful and sometimes terrifying world

As the culmination of World Book Week, there was a huge launch on 4<sup>th</sup> March in Trafal gar Square, with most of the authors present. The

BBC joined in with many radio programmes in the previous week, and a whole evening on the night itself.

An important aim of the event is for books to be shared. My books were given away in Wychwood Library, with the help of Ruth and Liz.
