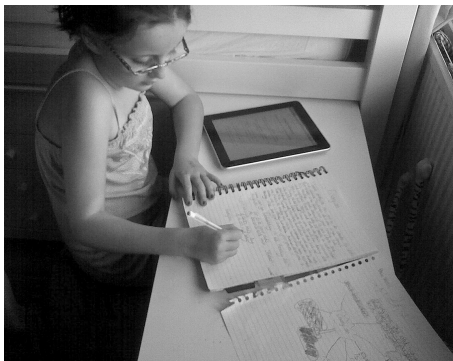


## Camilla Says Energize!
