Little Princess Trust

The Little Princess Trust supplies real hair wigs especially for children from the age of two and a half up to 18 (boys and girls) who suffer hair loss through alopecia or as a result of hospital/cancer treatment. The Trust was set up by a family who raised a lot of money for their daughter, also called Hannah, who was suffering cancer treatment. Sadly she lost her fight so they set up The Little Princess Trust. The wigs are made small enough for children's heads and they are fitted for the children



cut and styled as they would like.

Hannah had to keep her hair through the summer for showing her pony and for her Saplings performance as *Red Riding Hood*.

Ta Da!

On 5th October Hannah had her hair cut off in long pony-tail lengths of between 11 and 17 inches by her second cousin, Jane Rowley. Jane said, "the hair Hannah has donated was about five years growth." Hannah was happy to donate her hair as her view was "my hair will grow back and I will still have some left!"

So far Hannah has raised more than £375 (one wig costs £350). The hair donated gets sent to The Little Princess trust to be made into wigs. Hannah would like to thank everyone who supported her. She felt great when she went back to school on Monday and swept back her hood to show her new look, "Ta da" she said. So all you
